The Show that Started it All



Country Fried Steak

Ingredients:

Steak:

- 4 (4-oz) beef cube steaks
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp paprika
- 1 tsp onion powder
- 1/4 tsp cayenne pepper
- 3/4 cup buttermilk
- 1 large egg
- Oil, for frying



Gravy:

- 3 Tbsp all-purpose flour
- 3 cups milk
- Salt and pepper, to taste

Directions:

Preparation:

- 1.Fill a large skillet or sauté pan with about 1/4" oil and set the heat to medium-high.
- 2. Whisk the buttermilk and egg together in a medium-size shallow bowl. Combine the flour, paprika, onion powder, and cayenne pepper in a similarly sized shallow bowl. Dip each steak in the buttermilk and egg mixture followed by the flour mixture and set aside on a large plate. Repeat with the other three steaks.
- 3.When the oil in the skillet reaches 350°-375°, carefully add the steaks and brown both sides, about 3 minutes per side. Reduce the heat to medium-low, cover the skillet, and let the steaks cook for about 8 minutes. Remove the lid and cook for 1 minute more. Set the steaks aside on a large paper-towel lined plate; keep warm.
- 4.To prepare the gravy, sprinkle the flour into the same skillet and cook until lightly browned, about 3 minutes. Slowly add the milk and cook, stirring constantly, until thickened. Season with salt and pepper, to taste, and immediately plate the steaks with a generous drizzle of gravy.

There is an ever increasing ocean of knowledge around us which calls for efficient and improved knowledge acquisition techniques so that maximum knowledge can be retained by the learners. Research has indicated that it is better to let learners construct their learning, their learning goals and preferences. Thus, we can say that eLearning revolving around learners enhances individual learning efficiency and brings positive results.





Some benefits of collaborative learning are: Sharing ideas, information and knowledge

- Receiving/giving feedbacks
- Sharing wider perspective on the topics
- Getting help from experts among the group members
- Construction of new concepts
- Improved understanding of the subject matter
- Provide ideal environment for less involved people or those who are hesitant
- Learning collaborative support and responsibility
- Foster social and academic interaction among students
- Learning new roles and skills such as leadership, decision-making, and conflict-management skills
- Enhanced communication among members
- Motivation to move on in the course
- Increased overall achievement and improved self-esteem

Collaborative learning helps learners to move on when the course seems difficult and in providing them with an ongoing network of support. Thus, collaborative learning encourages positive interaction among the learners and should be an integral part of any online training/course.
